No password is needed to download the forms from the home page of our website under "Volunteer & Education Reporting Forms." *Once again, do not use the online system as it's not ready for data entry.*

To maintain your certified Master Gardener status, each year you must send in your 25 volunteer hours and 10 hours of education as well as pay your dues. *Without completing and reporting both the full volunteer and education hours, plus dues, you aren't considered certified.* If there are extenuating circumstances why you were unable to fulfill the requirements, please contact me. My contact information is below.

Here are the two ways to report your hours:

- 1. **Excel form:** The form be used on any PC and emailed. *This is the easiest and most accurate way to track hours.* Do not create your own spreadsheet.
- 2. **Paper form:** Paper has to be mailed and you need to make a copy for your records. The mailing address is on the form. Please write neatly. If I can't read it, I can't enter it.

Again, both forms can be found on the left side of the home page of our <u>website</u> under "Volunteer & Education Reporting Forms." The forms will download directly to your computer from the link.

When using the Excel form, remember to change the file name from "V&EAR Email Form" and save with your name and year of reporting. Example, Merry Gardener 2018. Send the entire spreadsheet as an attachment to your email. **Do not** separate your education and volunteer hours into two or more reports; do not save your file as a pdf and send; and *do not send as a shared (Google) drive.* Enter only one date per line, especially if you're submitting a paper report.
