Volunteer hours are due now

No password is needed to download the reporting forms from the home page of our website.

We use the information from the V&EAR for our Rutgers Cooperative Extension (RCE) and Rutgers University reports as well as for the annual recertification of Master Gardeners. (To be considered a certified Master Gardener we must receive your volunteer report and dues.) And, RCE receives additional funding based on total number of reported volunteer hours.

There are two ways to report your volunteer hours:

- 1. **Excel form:** Can be used on any PC and emailed. This is the easiest and most accurate way to track hours. Do not create your own spreadsheet or use a shared drive!
- 2. **Paper form:** Paper must be mailed, and you need to make a copy for records. The mailing address is on the form.

Both forms can be found under <u>"Volunteer Reporting"</u> on the lower right of the home page. Click on either form and you can save directly to your computer. Do not use the online volunteer reporting system as it's not ready for 2019 data entry.

When using the Excel form, please remember to save the file with your name and year of reporting. If you need help renaming your file, please ask. Send the entire report as one spreadsheet. Do *not* separate your education and volunteer hours into two or more reports or include another year on it. Enter only one date per line, especially if you're submitting a paper report. (If I can't read it, I can't enter it.) If you have any questions or need help, don't hesitate to contact me at 201-327-8835 or donable.com.
