You can log into the meeting from your computer, iPad, or smart phone by clicking on the link below a few minutes before 7:15 pm Oct. 20. This link is good for the Oct. 20 meeting only.

If you have the Zoom application installed on your device, you can also log in using the meeting ID and password: **Meeting ID: 976 5230 3987; passcode: 399381.**

After logging in either way, you'll be placed in the "waiting room" where you'll wait for the host to allow you to enter the meeting. By logging in a few minutes before 7:15 pm, you're leaving the host enough time to let all participants into the meeting. Be sure to turn on your device's camera and keep your audio/microphone muted during the meeting. To ask a question, you can send a "chat" to the host who will acknowledge your request. Icons for audio (a microphone), video, and chat options are at the bottom of the Zoom screen.

Spotted lanternfly – help stop its spread

Eight NJ counties — Burlington, Camden, Gloucester, Hunterdon, Mercer, Salem, Somerset, and Warren — are under quarantine for the spotted lanternfly. This means that anyone who travels in these counties is asked to do a quick inspection of their vehicle for the SLF before leaving. In Pennsylvania, 26 counties are under quarantine.

This invasive pest is known to feed on 70 different types of plants and trees. SLF has been confirmed in 16 NJ counties; no sightings have been reported in Bergen, Cape May, Cumberland, Ocean, or Passaic.
