Her orchids have won ribbons in many shows, including the Philadelphia Flower Show, and she's earned flower, cultural, and botanical awards from the American Orchid Society.

Carrie will cover orchid taxonomy, what makes an orchid an orchid, and what orchids grow well in New Jersey. Carrie will show orchids in bloom from her collection to illustrate their biodiversity. She welcomes you to bring your orchids to the Zoom meeting to display or discuss.
